HAVE YOU ASKED YOURSELF -"WHAT IS SCRIP?" SCRIP is a fundraising gift card program that allows you to shop with gift cards for your daily needs such as gas, groceries, clothing, animal feed, and restaurants, and any other need you may have. The vendors sell the certificates/gift cards to our program for a certain percentage less than the face value. That is how we arrive at a profit!
