COOKIES AND KRINGLES JUST IN TIME FOR CHRISTMAS!



Beginning on Tuesday, November 4th, all of our St. John Students are asked to participate in a school-wide fundraiser to offset the rising costs of bussing costs for field trips. Our students have many opportunities throughout the school year to attend many educational programs off campus. Some of the field trips our students participate in are the Heritage School, pumpkin farm experiences, Sheboygan County Museum, Theater for Young Audience, and many other opportunities throughout the school year. To help make this financially possible for all students, we are going to be selling cookie dough and Kringles for the upcoming Christmas holiday.

The homemade cookie dough sells in 3 pound tubs, there are 12 different varieties, and the selling cost is \$12.00. Our school will make a 50% profit on all cookie sales. The 22 oz. Kringles sell for \$11.00, and our school makes a 40% profit on all Kringle sales. It is our school goal to sell \$4000 in product, of which everyone in our school (no matter if they sell or not) will be treated to a build your own ice cream sundae celebration in January! The top selling class, by percent, will receive an all-you-can-eat pizza party also! Students that sell 10 items can also receive cash prizes.
